 (1) My place of residence is **1141 Queen Anne Pl., Los Angeles, Calif.** my occupation is **Professor of Music**
 (2) I was born in **Hong Kong, China** on **Jan. 10, 1877** My race is **Danish**
 (3) I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on **Jan. 21, 1929** in the **District**
 Court of **United States** at **Los Angeles, Calif.**
 (4) I am **married**. The name of my **wife** is **Hersilia**
 we were married on **June 27, 1916** at **Hong Kong, China** he was
 born at **Hong Kong, China** on **August 15, 1897** entered the United States
 at **San Francisco, Calif.** on **April - 1928** for permanent residence therein, and now
 resides at **with me** I have **2** children, and the name, date,
 and place of birth, and place of residence of each said child are as follows:
Emil - July 30, 1917; Vertrude - August 20, 1918; both born Hong Kong, Szech
Both reside with me. China.

DECLARATION OF INTENT

(8) My last foreign residence was **Hong Kong, China** my children born **in Hong Kong, China** assigned to the United States of
 America from **Do**. My lawful entry for permanent residence in the United States

 on **Oct. 15, 1926** on the vessel **Siberia Maru**
 as shown by the certificate of my arrival attached hereto.
 (9) I am not a debaucher or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching, debating or opposed
 to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the Constitution of the United States and
 will support the same to the best of my power. It is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and I have all allegiance and
 fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to the Emperor of Japan, which I have ever sworn to support.
